Prof. S.C. Saxena, Chairman, NRC-AICTE; Prof. R. Rudramoorthy, Chairman, Southern Regional Committee AICTE; Prof. B.B. Ahuja, Chairman AIB-VE; Financial Advisor, MHRD; The Secretary, Technical Education, Mizoram; The Secretary, Technical Education, Govt of Rajasthan; The Secretary, Technical Education, Odisha; The Secretary, Technical Education, Puducherry; Prof. A.K. Ray Director, IIEST, Kolkata (West Bengal); Prof. S.K. Kak, Former, VC, Jaypee University, Solan; The Chairman, UGC; Director General, IAMR, New Delhi and Director General, ICAR could not attend the meeting due to their prior engagements.

Prof. Anil D. Sahasrabudhe, Chairman-AICTE welcomed the members to the 108th Executive Committee meeting and briefed them about the recent initiatives of AICTE. He informed that internship for students of UG Studies in engineering is being made mandatory to provide proper training for them to get better employment opportunities when they pass out from the technical institutions. He apprised the members that AICTE has signed MOUs with various organizations viz. Internshala; NETiit; Engineering Council of India; NIELIT; TSSC, Skill Development Council etc. for providing avenues to the students for finding suitable internships in industries.

He further informed that AICTE is organizing meeting with Members of Parliament(MPs) on implementation 'Unnat Bharat Abhiyaan" under which MPs will be encouraged to adopt Technical institutions in their constituencies. This will help in developmental work of their respective constituencies where students and teachers of these technical institutions can participate in various initiatives for growth and progress in terms of education, sanitation and

other welfare measures for their constituencies. He further mentioned that PMSSS J&K scholarships scheme is being implemented successfully and the number of applicants for the J&K scholarship scheme during the present academic year 2017-18 increased to 24700 as compared to the last year figure of 10000 showing a remarkable popularity of the scheme amongst the J&K students. The Council is also contemplating to implement a scheme of "Éarn while Learn" to provide financial support and work experience for the students of technical education.

		The Executive Committee after detailed deliberations approved the draft curriculum for additional specialization "Holistic Sciences in Sanskrit" in Sector "Culture" under NSQF.
Item No. 108.03.02	:	To consider and approve the Annual Accounts of the Council for the Financial Year 2016-17.
		The Finance Bureau, AICTE made a presentation on Annual Accounts for the financial year 2016-17. The Executive Committee was apprised of the receipts and payment of funds under different Heads of Accounts under Plan and Non-Plan.
		The Executive Committee was also informed that Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India is not providing any grants under Non-Plan category and the Council generates funds internally to meet the expenditure on its establishment, salaries, wages and other administrative expenditure and has become self-supporting. The Council also provides grants to various schemes from the funds generated internally. The Executive Committee also noted that the Accounting procedures have been made automated through online mechanism through RTGS/NEFT/DBT and the books of Accounts are generated through TALLY.
		After detailed deliberations, the Executive Committee approved the Annual Accounts of the Council for the financial year 2016-17. The Executive Committee also appreciated the efforts made by the Finance Bureau for on time completion of annual accounts.

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Item No. 108.03.03	To consider the request of the Haryana state Govt. for rationalization of Courses and Intake including closure of courses in various Govt./Govt. Society Polytechnics w.e.f A/Y 2014-15, 2015-16.
	The Executive was informed that the polytechnic institutions of Govt. of Haryana did not submit online applications on the AICTE portal from the academic year 2014-15, hence were not granted approval from the year 2014-15. However, these institutions continued to admit students and have started new courses & changed intake and closed several courses without AICTE approval. The Govt. of Haryana now approached AICTE seeking ratification of these changes made from the year 2014 onwards through the MHRD.
	Keeping in view the interests of students already admitted in these Govt. institutions and the fact that number of seats reduced by closing of the courses (7080) far outnumbered number of increased seats due to opening of new courses (2730), the Executive Committee approved the request of Govt. of Haryana to ratify the starting of new courses & change in intake and closure of courses in various Govt./ Govt. Society Polytechnics from the academic year 2014-15; 2015-16; 2016-17 and 2017-18.
	Further, the Executive Committee decided that a stern warning may be issued to these polytechnic institutions and the Govt. of Haryana to adhere to the norms and procedures laid down by the Council to avoid such a situation in future.
